

DIRECTIONS TO THE ANHEUSER-BUSCH INSTITUTE

From I-64/Highway 40 traveling east – (Due to the Grand Bridge construction)
Exit I-64/Highway 40 at the Vandeventer exit (36C). Turn right on Vandeventer Ave. to Chouteau Ave. Turn left on Chouteau Ave. to Grand Blvd. Turn right on Grand Blvd. to Shaw Ave. Turn right on Shaw Ave. to ABI parking garage entrance on right.

From I-64/Highway 40 traveling west – (Due to the Grand Bridge construction)
Exit I-64/Highway 40 at the Market St. exit (38B). Turn left on Market St. to S. Compton Ave. Turn left on S. Compton Ave. to Chouteau Ave. Turn right on Chouteau Ave. to Grand Blvd. Turn left on Grand Blvd. to Shaw Ave. Turn right on Shaw Ave. to ABI parking garage entrance on right.

From I-44 – Exit I-44 at the Grand Blvd. exit. Turn right on Grand Blvd. to Shaw Ave. Turn right on Shaw Ave. to ABI parking garage entrance on right.

Enter building from top level of garage; proceed past registration desk to last hallway on left; turn left to elevator on left; go to third floor; exit elevator; turn right and proceed down hall; the auditorium is on right.

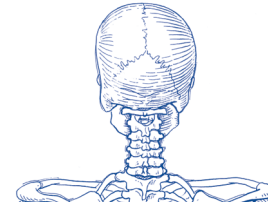
