#### **Saint Louis University (2003 – Present)**

St. Louis University is a private, Jesuit, research university with campuses in St. Louis, MO and Madrid, Spain. The oldest university west of the Mississippi River, SLU is home to 12,000 students, 3,000 faculty, 9 colleges/schools including schools of medicine and law, and a \$2.1B endowment. The university is seeing a period of significant enrollment and research growth and has just completed a \$500M capital campaign. Driven by the Jesuit focus on human dignity and social justice, SLU plays a pivotal role in advancing science, developing future leaders, and improving the human condition around the world.

Provided strategic and operational leadership for a multidisciplinary college comprised of a School of Public Health, School of Social Work, and highly ranked programs in Criminology / Criminal Justice, Urban Planning and Development and Applied Behavior Analysis. Prior to a university reorganization in 2021, CPHSJ was home to 1100 undergraduate and graduate students, 65 faculty, and multiple research centers.

#### **Founding Director & Professor, Center for Outcomes Research – (2003-2017)**

Established a new academic division within the School of Medicine focused on extramural research examining the impact of disease, health interventions and policy on health outcomes. Across five years, SLUCOR grew into a university-wide degree-granting center with primary and

secondary faculty members, an extensive portfolio of extramural research funding, structured corporate consulting operations and formal graduate programs in health outcomes research and data science.

**Interim Director, SLU'S Clinical Research and Clinical Trials Organization (2004 – 2005)**

Provided operational leadership for the university's clinical trials organization including oversight of all administrative, research and clinical staff; negotiated new clinical trials contracts, directed research operations and insured compliance with all legal and regulatory requirements,
